



Introducing myQuiz: myfuture.edu.au's new multi-media resources for career development

myQuiz is a suite of five fun interactive multi-media games and quizzes designed to assist young people to better understand and use career information and concepts when undertaking career development.

Teachers and career practitioners can use **myQuiz** with individual students and in the classroom. **myQuiz** can assist students to effectively explore and better understand career concepts, occupations, industries, education and training pathways, and job searching.

Students with low literacy levels will find **myQuiz** accessible as the objects are supported by audio and animation.

What is available?

Career Quiz – More than just a job: explores the foundation concepts and underpinning theory of career development.

Getting that Job Quiz: investigates ideas, concepts and strategies about effective job search techniques.

Exploring Occupations: A Flight Attendant provides examples of components of an occupation (for example, work conditions and personal requirements) that students may need to consider when exploring an occupation of interest to them.

Exploring Industries: A Seafood Industry employee provides examples of what students need to explore and consider about industries when developing their career ideas (for example, related industries, related occupations).

Exploring Education and Training Pathways: A worker in the electro-technology industry explains the education and training pathway they took to reach their career goal to assist students in understanding, for example, qualifications, education and training pathways and New Apprenticeships.
